Dear Friends,

There are many ways to describe 2020 and though it was certainly an unprecedented year that brought significant challenges, I can look back on it with a sense of pride and accomplishment for The Ann Storck Center (ASC). Prior to mid-March when COVID came into our lives and changed our path, I was optimistic about opportunities for ASC. Florida was enjoying a thriving economy; unemployment rates were at a record low and conversations about employers hiring people with disabilities were at a record high. In February, we successfully had our Inaugural 5K All Hearts 5K Run/Walk at Nova Southeastern University.

Then on March 13 2020, I conducted a Town Hall Meeting with Staff to announce that we would be closing the campus to visitors due to the pandemic. Our adult day training program, all heart educational center and therapy programs were conducted using alternative COVID-19 safety-based methods until further notice. I look forward to 2021 with renewed hope and energy.
