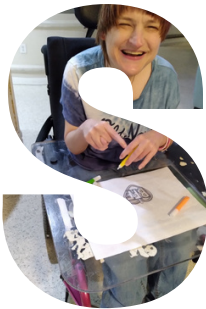

Our Respite Program aims to provide temporary care and support while giving caregivers a much-needed break. This program offers a safe and nurturing environment in your own home where trained professionals cater to the individual needs of each child. By offering specialized care and engaging activities, our goal is to enhance your child's well-being and development. Meanwhile, caregivers can take time for themselves, knowing that their loved ones are in good hands. Families are eligible for up to 200 hours of respite

Our Mission

The Ann Storck Center (ASC) is dedicated to enriching the lives of children and adults with developmental disabilities while empowering them to discover their abilities and build independence. The Center is known and recognized for its advocacy and dedication to caring for both children and adults with severe multiple developmental disabilities and its commitment to excellence.

Our Story

It originates in 1951, when pediatric nurse Ann Storck retired to South Florida to open her heart and home to children with developmental disabilities. Four years later, Ann opened the Pediatric Care Center to serve 55 children. The Pediatric Care Center evolved into Ann Storck Center in 1981.

Today, the Center accommodates 96 permanent residents and serves more than 300 clients daily through critical care, learning and ability focused programs. We are the oldest non-profit in Broward County to serve this developmental disabled population.



Adult Day Training Reopening

In August of 2024, ASC reopened the doors to the newly-renovated Adult Day Training facility. This facility now provides specialized therapies to dozens of adults in our community daily.

28th Annual Celebrity Chef Event

We hosted our 28th Annual Celebrity Chef's Event with over 20 restaurants and 350 attendees. The event raised over \$200,000 and is gaining lots of momentum!



ASC reintroduces Expressive Arts Program

With help from the Taft Foundation, ASC was able to kick-start Expressive Arts within the ADT! Thanks to them, and our art teacher Greer Sommer, the adults we serve at the ADT now have access to Art Therapy.
